

Goofy 'Urinetown' Goes Beyond Restroom Humor

"Urinetown, the Musical" takes a risk with toilet-based humor and subject matter — but it's a risk that landed it three Tony Awards. And 21 year later, it's still a risk worth taking for two hours of laughter. The Studio Theatre Tierra del Sol brings out the best in the goofy, self-aware musical, which it is performing now through Feb. 26.

On a dingy, brick-lined city street, Little Sally and other poor city folk line up at "public amenity number nine.'

In order to use the toilet they must pay a fee to Penelope Pennywise (Whitney Morse), employee of Urine Good Company, a corrupt organization with a monopoly over all public facilities.

Politician bribed by the company have passed a law banning private toilets and public urination, which the cops, also bribed by the company, strictly enforce, leaving the poor folks in

Old Man Strong (Alyson E. Johnson), who is carted off to the mysterious Urinetown with a dramatic flair, serves as an example to potential rule-breakers.

It's a concept so absurd it can only be treated with humor to

match, which the laugh-a-minute show has in abundance. Adding to the absurdity is Officer Lockstock's (Craig Smith) frequent breaking of the fourth wall.

"It's kind of a mythical place, you understand. A bad place. A place you won't see until Act Two," he says of Urinetown.

The cast's skill in playing up the

goofiness of the characters made each one lovable, evil though they may be, like UGC owner Caldwell B. Cladwell (Mark Kirschenbaum).

 $The \ imposing, two-story, dimly$ lit set helped draw one into the dystopian world.

"For the artistic elements we have drawn on inspiration from the Dust Bowl era and given it a wicked dystopian feel," said director Nathaniel Niemi.

Show hero Bobby Strong (Christian Quinto) leads the poor city folk in a "Les Misérables"-esque revolution.

In a genre with sometimes cheesy optimism, "Urinetown" was a refreshing commentary on some true-to-life subject matter. And The Studio succeeded in getting lots of laughs — even at the potty jokes. "I thought the performers were

spectacular and the way they tied the music and comedy made it a very interesting show," said Danny Shelley, of the Village of Collier. For tickets and more informa-
